
The following students' who received Gold Awards came in the top 2% of competitors around the world:

Year 12 are reminded that they are required to be at school every day until the last day of Term 3 in order to complete core and elective courses of study.

On Thursday 20 July, approximately 761 people attended Subject Selection Evening for students moving from Year 8 to Year 9 and Year 10 to Year 11. It was a very successful and informative evening for our students and their families. Thanks to Mr Barbuto and Mr Le for organising the evening so well and to Ms Garcia for the work in putting the complex Subject Booklets together and to all staff who contributed to our students making informed decisions about their future schooling.

On Wednesday 10 August our Annual HSC Art exhibition was held. This was an opportunity for our HSC students to showcase their major Art Works before they are sent away for marking. Over the past years we have had students' work selected for Art Express (a state wide series of exhibitions that show the best and the variety of HSC major works). Fairvale High School provides students with quality programs by integrating current technologies into teaching and learning. Students have access to 3D printers, Robotics and game development software which help to enhance the achievement of outcomes in all Computing subjects. Students enjoy the challenge of the design concept to develop an exciting solution to a variety of given problems.

As part of their course work, students studying Information Processes and Technology (Preliminary course) are required to set up a fictitious company. They utilise 3D modelling software and the 3D printer to create souvenirs which support advertising and representing their company. The process includes developing a prototype, designing the solution and printing the final product.

In the Software Design and Development course, students in Mr Azer's class have enjoyed creating interactive computer games for their major project using Scratch block programming language. This software motivated students to create very innovative solutions.

MATHS INSPIRATION





We got to hear about and observe many different experiences with Mathematics from Matt Parker, a stand-up mathematical comedian, Jen Rogers who is a data engineer and author Rob Eastaway. Matt had decided to make a circuit out of 10,000 dominoes, Jen explained that correlation doesn't necessary means causation and Rob told a story how you could become a millionaire in a month by simply asking your parents to pay you 1c on the first day and double it each subsequent day. It was a great experience overall and it has really shown us that Maths
