PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Although it is now week 5, I would like to welcome staff and students back to term 3, which once again has been productive with quite a variety of educational activities and events.

Year 12 Trial HSC examinations took place in Weeks 1 and 2 and the students now have their exam results and teacher feedback to assist them in their preparation for the HSC examinations in Term 4. It is important to remind students of the value of the teacher feedback given and to take time to use all the resources that the school can offer before the HSC examinations. Year 12 are reminded that they are required to be at school every day until the last day of Term 3 in order to complete core and elective courses of study. They are encouraged to engage with their teachers and use the after school tutoring centre for support and academic advice.

On Thursday 25 July, many students and their families attended Subject Selection Evening for students moving from Year 8 to Year 9 and Year 10 to Year 11. It was a very successful and informative evening for our students and their families. Thanks Mr Barbuto, Mr Le and Ms Grills for organising the evening so well, to Ms Garcia for the work in putting the complex Subject Booklets together and to all staff who contributed to our students making informed decisions about their future schooling. Following this later in the week, Year 10 students were invited to discuss their subject choices in one on one conversations with our deputies and HT Maths. This tailored approach is designed to ensure students make the correct subject choice. Ultimately it is important that students are happy with their choices for future success moving toward the attainment of their HSC.

On Wednesday 14 August our Annual HSC Art exhibition was held and with Ms Lila Mularczyk OAM opening the exhibition. This was an opportunity for our Year 12 students to showcase their "HSC Body of Work" pieces before they are sent away for marking. Over the past years we have had students' work selected for Art Express a state wide series of exhibitions that show the best and the variety of HSC major works. Thanks to all the Visual Arts staff, in particular the Year 12 teachers Ms Haberecht and Ms Nou.





STEM - FLOATING GARDEN

YOUTH ENGAGEMENT STRATEGY SEMESTER 1



The Youth Engagement Strategy gives students the opportunity to participate in a TAFE course while still at school. The courses run for nine days either in blocks or one day per week. There is a maximum of 15 students per course. Our students participated in Horticulture in term one and Hairdressing in term two.

In term one the Horticulture

students planted trees and shrubs and improved on the pond behind the Bini Shell. The students gained skills such as laying turf, preparing soil and planting native shrubs.



In term two students participated in a Hairdressing course at Granville TAFE. The course involved learning about aspects of hairdressing such as washing and blow drying, cutting and colouring hair. The partnership between FVHS and TAFE has been



a very productive and expansive experience for the students.
