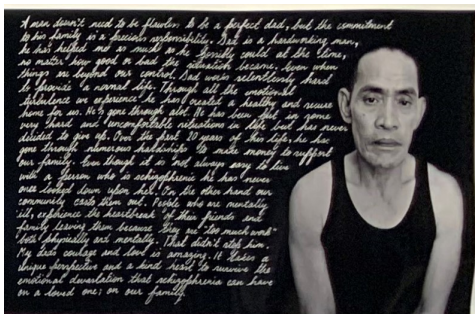
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## ART EXPRESS 2019

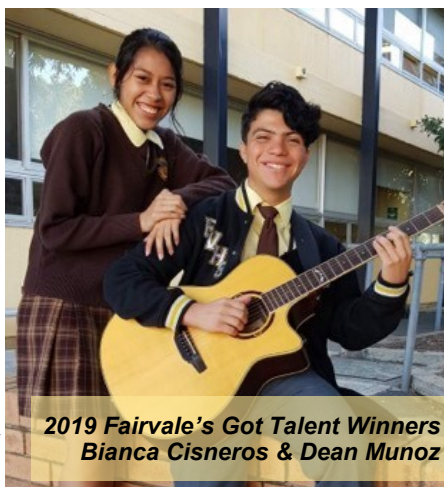
The performances included singing and dancing that certainly entertained the crowd. The event was a success, and the process of organising was extensive and the preparation was intense.

For example the setup/pack down team's job was to set up the stage before each act and pack it up for the upcoming performance. This was not an easy job as they were required to move equipment around the stage and were also required to stay back after school to remove it after the show.

The sound stage/lighting crew were in charge of organising the music, microphones etc. and the lights for the show. Messengers were required to deliver messages from one place to another. For example, Mr Hart wanted to tell the lighting crew to change the colour of a light and point it in a different direction, using a messenger student to deliver that to the lighting crew. Another role was the green room crew. Students in charge of this area were helping performers calm their nerves down before going on stage, doing voice warm up exercises and equipping performers with their musical instruments.

Overall, Fairvale's Got Talent was smooth running and well executed thanks to the organisers, Mrs Wilkinson, Mr Tran, Mr Hart and the SRC members. All students displayed exceptional effort in their practice time, which was clearly evident in their performances. 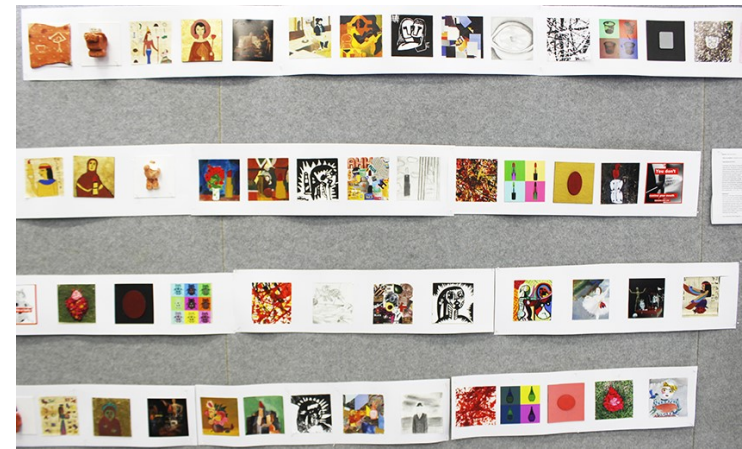




## ORDINARY TO EXTRAORDINARY - SENIOR ART

Senior Art students showcased their work in a recent exhibition at the Art Shed on Monday 20 May. Year 11 Visual Arts students turned the *Ordinary to Extraordinary* when they picked an everyday object and carefully placed it within their miniature works. They manipulated their object through each of the art movements to create a timeline of art.

Through *The Little People Project*, Year 11 Photography students created concertina books based on the contemporary artwork of Slinkachu. They created a surreal world through small characters and utilised their natural environment to capture their short story books.

They appropriated famous artworks, advertising or graphic works to comment on either social, political issues or popular culture.

Many students and staff of Fairvale High School came to appreciate the artwork and the exhibition was a great success.





## SOLAR OVEN EXPERIMENT

In my Investigating Science class we built solar ovens over a period of a few weeks. We formed small groups to design and build a solar oven. The experiment was about timing how long it would take to melt a Smores cookie which we made out of a cookie, chocolate chips and a marshmallow.

We used the following materials; cardboard boxes, foil, black paper, scissors, ruler, sticky tape, straws, a stopwatch and thermometer.

The reason that we used a cardboard box because it was easy to make a design out of and easy to collect and cover the box. While we designed our oven, we used aluminium foil and sticky tape to cover all around the box. We also used a sheet of clear plastic to attract the heat and black paper inside the box to conduct the heat.

We used a thermometer to check the temperature so that we could measure the heat in the oven. We used the stop watch to time how long it took to melt the chocolate chips and marshmallows on our cookies. It was a very delicious experiment.

A project is underway to upgrade Fairvale High School. The project will increase the school's capacity and includes:

- 30 permanent teaching areas including science, technology, food tech and other specialised classroom spaces
- replacing the Bini Dome structure with a multipurpose facility.

### Progress summary

Site remediation work as been completed and the Department of Planning and Environment pre-commencement conditions are being addressed.

### Next steps

Over the next month we will be changing head contractors.

Site establishment will commence once a new head contractor has been appointed and construction will recommence later in 2019.

## 2019 ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

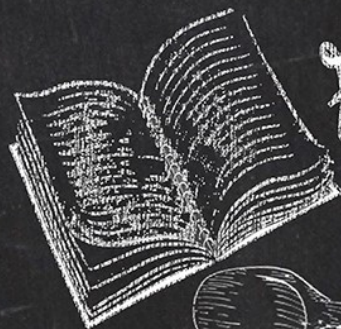
