RECIPE for Spiced cherry tomato and avocado canapé's - makes 36

Mis en place

brunoise onion

preheat oven to 190 °C

remove stones from avocado coarsely chop tomatoes

wash, dry, pick and chop parsley

Ingredients

2 avocados 250g cherry tomatoes ½ small red onion ⅓ C fresh continental parsley olive oil spray 36 wonton wrappers ⅓ C natural yoghurt 10-12 drops of Tabasco sauce 2 T lemon juice salt and pepper

Method

- 1. Spray a mini muffin pan with oil. Press a wonton wrapper into each hole. Bake for 8 minutes or until golden brown. Set aside in the muffin pan to cool.
- Place avocado and yoghurt in a bowl. Stir to combine. Add the Tabasco sauce to taste. In a separate bowl, combine tomato, onion, lemon juice and parsley. Season with salt and pepper.
- 3. Spoon the avocado mixture evenly among the wonton cups. Arrange on a serving platter and top with the tomato mixture. Garnish with remaining parsley and serve immediately.







DELICIOUS MICROORGANISMS

In the past few weeks in Science, our class 8X has been learning about microorganisms. A microorganism is a microscopic organism, especially a bacterium, virus, or fungus that may be found in particular foods or areas. In this practical lesson, 8X made our own yoghurt. In our yoghurt, we had to include some fresh milk, a spoonful of yoghurt into the milk and leave it to heat until it started to boil a little. When our yoghurt had boiled, we took it off the heat and poured it into a bowl with a clean cloth wrapped around it. We then waited two days for our next lesson and saw the reveal of our own yoghurts.

This practical lesson was one that showed us how microorganisms are contained in foods and was really fun to experience how we could make our own yoghurts.

HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR YONDR POUCH





Yondr is committed to the health and safety of our school partners. Given the recent COVID-19 developments, Yondr encourages schools to take the following precautionary measures:

Cleaning pouches with a washer / dryer:

- 1. Close all the pouches
- 2. Wash pouches in a short speed wash or thirty (30) minute wash under either warm / cold setting using regular detergent
- 3. Air dry or put pouches in a dryer on **low heat for less than fifteen (15) minutes**. Please note that higher temperatures can damage pouches.



Cleaning pouches with disinfectant and / or sanitiser wipes:

- 1. Close all the pouches
- 2. Wipe disinfectant / wipe on all parts of the pouch
- 3. Open all the pouches and turn inside-out
- 4. Wipe disinfectant / wipe on all parts of the pouch
- 5. Close all the pouches
