HUMAN RIGHTS LEADERSHIP FORUM

On April 27th, the students of Class 10A English had the opportunity to attend the Human Rights Leadership Forum, a conference focused on promoting human rights and empowering individuals to become leaders within their communities. The event was held at Cabramatta library and was attended by students from several schools in the area.

At the beginning of the event, Lorraine Finlay from the Human Rights Commission and Hugh Kingsly, the creator of the Human Rights Game, were introduced as the hosts. Together, they guided the students through a comprehensive exploration of human rights issues across the globe, incorporating numerous discussions and opportunities for the exchange of opinions. During these discussions they were also introduced to the "Human Rights Game." The game engaged the students in discussing the challenges encountered by individuals around the world, spanning topics such as asylum seekers and animal testing. It was a wonderful opportunity for students to express their unique perspectives and gain insight into the diverse viewpoints of their peers. The game was a fun and engaging way to learn about human rights and allowed the students to fully understand the importance of protecting and promoting these rights in our communities and around the world.

The day's events ended in a panel discussion featuring Lisa Porter, the Director of Educational Leadership, in which students were given the opportunity to ask questions and articulate their concerns on matters of significance to them within the realm of education. Overall, the excursion was an eye-opening experience for the students, who gained valuable knowledge and skills to become leaders in promoting human rights in their communities.

TRANSITION TO WORK ACTIVITIES



TERM 1 AND 2 UPDATE FROM THE SCIENCE FACULTY



Year 11 Biology have been learning about cellular processes such as photosynthesis and fermentation. In the last weeks of Term 1, our Year 11 Biology classes made bread, to explore how microorganisms undertake fermentation and therefore provide food for humans to eat.



Year 8 completed a research project in Term 1, where they made paints out of coloured minerals, egg and water. These mineral paints have been used for many thousands of years in cave paintings and traditional body paintings.



Year 7 have been learning about body systems and how they are important in keeping us alive. Our Year 7 students made model lungs using balloons and water bottles, to help visualise an important process in the human body



Year 10 studied infectious and non-infectious diseases and how they are spread. They participated in a simulation activity to model the spread of infectious disease through a community, using liquids of different pH values. This helped our students understand how easy it is to spread disease through physical contact and poor hygiene.



Year 9 have been learning about atoms and the Periodic Table of Elements. Our Year 9 students have had the opportunity to make atoms in class to gain a deeper understanding into particles that are very small and hard to see.

ANZAC DAY

On Wednesday 26th of April, Fairvale High School held an ANZAC Day ceremony, hosting the whole school in the new J block hall. The History faculty together with the SRC organised the day which included guests from Smithfield RSL and the Armed Forces. Fairvale was honoured to have the presence of Mr Douglas Clarke - the Branch Vice President of Smithfield RSL and Lance Corporal Mr Patrick Chalmers.

It has been quite some time since Fairvale HS has had the opportunity to have an ANZAC Day ceremony in school.
