WORK INSPIRATION PROGRAM

The Smith Family and Fairvale High School offered 20 Year 10 students a unique opportunity to take a look behind-the-scenes at the opportunities that the Hospitality, Service and Aged Care industries provide. They took part in the Work Inspiration program. Work Inspiration is an Australia-wide, employer-led program that ensures young Australians' first experience of the world of work is positive, meaningful, and inspiring.

As part of the program, over two days, **Tuesday 2 April 2024 and Wednesday 3 April**, students learnt about the various roles linked to the Hospitality, Service and Aged Care industries and the activities involved in the day-to-day operations of:

- West Hotel in Sydney,
- Bunnings in Minchinbury and
- BUPA Aged Care in North Rocks.

The structured Work Inspiration activities incorporated into this program provided students with the opportunity to learn more about their skills and preferences, the workplace, and how they can design and navigate their future.

At the West Hotel, they met the Hotel Manager, the Human Resources Manager, The Front of House Manager, the Housekeeping Manager and the Food and Beverages Manager. They also took part in a guided tour of the hotel and completed activities to reflect on their skills and interests to help them consider possible career paths. They were inspired by hearing the story of Conrad Hilton, an American businessman, who founded the Hilton Hotels group which now has more than 7,600 properties and nearly 1.2 million rooms in 126 countries and territories.

Students learnt about the Hilton group's customer complaint resolution process - HEART. When a guest complains staff need to Hear, Empathise, Apologise, Resolve the problem, and say Thank You to the guest for raising their concern. This is a good philosophy for resolving complaints in our own life.

At Bunnings they learnt about careers in trade and retail and spoke to employees about their career journeys and the various professions and jobs they had before joining Bunnings. Whilst at Bunnings some of the girls constructed a flat pack bench that Bunnings will donate to a local Primary School. Students who don't have anyone to play with can sit on the 'Buddy Bench' and other students then know to invite them to join their group so they are not alone.

At BUPA Aged Care students learnt about the various career paths in aged care, such as nursing, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, activities organiser to name just a few. Students enjoyed the opportunity to talk to some of the residents and ask them questions and for life advice. The residents offered advice such as: polish your shoes, don't rush about as you can injure yourself and suffer through life, be kind to others, learn to control your anger and value your education

Ms Efthymiades, accompanied the students and was impressed with how the students conducted themselves, the questions they asked, the comments they made and the respect they showed to all the people that they met over the two days.

UNIVERSITY OF SYDNEY USYD PROGRAM

THE UNIVERSITY OF SYDNEY, FUTURE FOCUS, ACTIVATE USYD PROGRAM EXCURSION

On Friday 17 May, 35 Year 12 students who are part of the University of Sydney, Future Focus, Activate USYD program enjoyed an on campus experience. It is part of an intensive year long program designed to build educational capacity, motivation, and career knowledge in students in their final year of high school, as well as support their access and transition to further study at the University of Sydney.

The event was designed to enrich their understanding and confidence for life after high school. They explored how to effectively search for information, course requirements, scholarships and admission pathways.

Students were met by university ambassadors, one of whom was an ex Fairvale High School student who is now studying at the university. They participated in a campus tour followed by a staff and Student Ambassador-led session on important Sydney University information.

Students also participated in self-chosen practical faculty experiences and had a chance to have any specific questions they may have answered at a faculty expo.

Ms Efthymiades, who accompanied the students, was so proud of Fairvale students. They answered quiz questions in the group session in front of 185 other students from different schools and won prizes. Some then volunteered to be group presenters in the practical faculty experiences when they were put in groups with students from other schools.

Students will participate in another workshop at school later this term aimed to build on knowledge gained during the on campus visit.
