Congratulations Year 7 for the fantastic effort and behaviour across all your subjects in term one. Keep up the great work!






Students have the opportunity to present ideas for activities that they would like to see being offered, support a teacher to run an activity or run an activity with the support of a teacher.



YEAR 7 AND 10 VACCINATIONS


NSW Health works with schools to offer the vaccines recommended and funded for adolescents by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) in a school-based vaccination program, including:

- diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis, (whooping cough), (dTpa)
- · human papillomavirus (HPV) meningococcal ACWY.

The next vaccination days for 2025 are:

- Year 10 9th April 2025
- Year 7 11th June 2025
- Catch up day for missed vaccinations for both Year 7 and 10 will be on 3rd September 2025.
